



Effects of the silk road on ports 丝绸之路对港口的影响

Impact on shipping routes

Increase traffic route Europe-China

Forecast of the total Europe-Asia traffic will be around 40 million TEUs by 2040*

• Increase traffic through the Mediterranean

There would be a potential reduction of up to 15% in traffic from China to North Sea ports*.

Increase traffic route Intra Asia

Improved transport to and within China will facilitate trade to other states through the Far East.

Shift from shipping to rail as a result of improving rail infrastructures

- Development of new hubs
- Shift of competitive positions among ports
- Expansion of Chinese commercial interests in ports
- Investment in ports to attract the increase of traffic
